Here are a few highlights from the most happening areas of The Palm Beaches, from the Jupiter Lighthouse to the Boca Inlet.



REGIONS - NORTH

JUPITER

Major League Baseball Spring Training action at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium is just the beginning of the experience at this picturesque northern enclave. A visit to the historic, ca. 1860 Jupiter Lighthouse puts you literally on top of the action, while a radiant sunset cruise on a PonTiki party boat connects you with the beautiful Jupiter Inlet below. Kayaking down the legendary "Wild and Scenic" Loxahatchee River is a great way to take in the local flora and fauna, while the newly renovated Maltz Jupiter Theatre offers worldclass cultural nourishment.

JUNO BEACH

Eco adventurers take note: Juno Beach is your waterfront paradise, a town brimming with all-natural charms and myriad opportunities to explore the wonders of Mother Earth. Take a dive off Juno Ledge to come face to face with South Florida's most exotic and colorful reef fish, or bring your mukluks and explore the region's 12 coastal native ecosystems, binoculars in hand. Stroll the Juno Dunes Natural Area, and experience an up-close encounter with a glorious sea turtle at Loggerhead Marinelife Center.

PALM BEACH GARDENS

One of The Palm Beaches' most heralded annual sporting events, formerly named **The Honda Classic**, a major golf event returns to the **PGA National Resort** in February here in Palm Beach Gardens, bringing the best of the PGA Tour to this spacious and cultivated city. But Palm Beach Gardens is as famous for its shopping as

its greens, so no visit is complete without some retail therapy at the famous **Gardens Mall** and al fresco **Downtown Palm Beach Gardens**, experiences complete with top-rated restaurants and a multiplex cinema.

RIVIERA BEACH / SINGER ISLAND

Sporty visitors flock, steer and paddle to these twin Edens off the eastern coast of the county's mainland, which bring the unspoiled waters of the Caribbean to The Palm Beaches. With its abundant and diverse marine life, the world-famous **Blue Heron Bridge** is a delight for divers and snorkelers, while **Manatee Lagoon—an FPL Eco-Discovery Center** is the ideal spot to observe these gentle sea cows in their natural habitat. **Riviera Beach Marina Village** is the central gathering spot for boat and kayak rentals, dining and more.

PALM BEACH

A gilded island with the rich history of being "America's First Resort Destination," Palm Beach is home to **Worth Avenue**, one of the nation's most famous shopping streets. But its history of luxury hospitality is only one facet of this growing familyfriendly destination, with its Instagrammable bougainvillea-draped architecture, and a free **Lake Trail** offering walkers and cyclists million-dollar views of waterfront mansions. **Pan's Garden**, with its iconic sculpture of the fluted Pan of Rohallion, is another complimentary attraction, while the **Flagler Museum** is a lavish throwback to the island's opulent heritage.

WEST PALM BEACH

A world of opportunities thrives in the county seat of The Palm Beaches, whose dynamite downtown, filled with dining, culture and retail, is just minutes from Palm Beach International Airport. From Broadway shows to music legends and top comedians, the Kravis Center is the crown jewel of West Palm Beach's bustling Arts & Entertainment District, while the nearby Norton Museum is a first-rate destination for the visual arts. Enjoy the roar of Lion Country Safari, a one-of-a-kind drivethru animal attraction, or bring the family to Dreher Park, where the Palm Beach Zoo and Cox Science Center & Aquarium are separated by a 10-minute walk. Or, for a bit more action, visit Okeeheelee Park. With over 1.700 acres, it's an inviting catchall for sports both common and unusual, including Okeeheelee BMX, Palm Beach County's only BMX race track, and Shark Wake Park, which features five freshwater lakes custom-designed for competition water skiing, making this world-class facility a haven for professional and amateur skiers alike. It also offers the largest floating obstacle course on the East Coast.

LAKE WORTH BEACH

Hip eateries, unique shops and colorful art galleries line the streets of this inviting and offbeat city, a favorite for nightlife and public art. The latter is especially plentiful at the annual **Lake**





National Polo Center

Worth Street Painting Festival, where artists create transient masterworks on the downtown pavement each February. The Lake Worth Lagoon is a vital resource for eco-tourists to explore the region, while the Cultural Council for Palm Beach County headquarters is the place for visitors to view work from local artists and learn about all of The Palm Beaches' cultural assets.

WELLINGTON

For athletes and sports spectators alike, it's all about the horse play at this illustrious western village, a quiet and homey region that doubles as one of the world's top destinations for equestrian sport. Top riders in polo, dressage and other sports descend on Wellington for annual gatherings like the Winter Equestrian Festival, making the National Polo Center and Wellington International global attractions. The stellar Wellington Environmental Preserve—with its a six-story observation tower and the popular Wellington Mall continue to increase Wellington's cachet.

REGIONS - SOUTH

BOYNTON BEACH

From the croak of Florida alligators and flutter of great blue herons at the world-famous **Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge** to relaxing shopping and dining at **Renaissance Commons**, this eclectic and emerging city offers enjoyment for a broad spectrum of visitors. Boynton Beach has one of the most active outdoor art districts in all of The Palm Beaches, while its ongoing, 16-acre **Town Square** redevelopment project is breathing new life to a historic downtown, from an amphitheater to a cultural center to a new retail space.

DELRAY BEACH

A three-time All America City winner and the recipient of Rand-McNally's Most Fun Small Town in America, Delray Beach is famous for its walkable downtown, its quirky public murals and its infinite array of chef-driven restaurants, fashion-forward retailers and free outdoor concerts. **Downtown Atlantic Avenue** is the place to enjoy all of it, while the **Delray Beach Market**, just off the beaten path, is the largest food hall in Florida and a destination unto itself. Amid all the bustle, make some time for a visit to the tranquil Zen oasis known as the **Morikami Museum and Japanese Gardens**.

BOCA RATON

The southern Palm Beaches' linchpin for laid-back luxury, Boca Raton is both resort town and college town, a place where worldly culture and beachy comfort combine. Nestled among historic Mediterranean-revival architecture. Mizner Park and Roval Palm Place offer a bevy of al fresco shopping and dining opportunities. The Boca Raton Museum of Art is one of South Florida's preeminent art museums, while the Town Center Mall is one of the nation's great indoor shopping experiences. College football fans, take note: Boca Raton is also home to Florida Atlantic University, which hosts the nationally televised Boca Raton Bowl each December. Exhibitions such as "The Hidden World of the Everglades" and the unprecedented "Journey Through the Human Brain" bring science and nature alive, while the Conservation Course offers a mini golf experience with an ecoconscious theme. The center also showcases a 10,000-gallon aquarium and a planetarium hosting both laser concerts and educational videos.

Most golf courses don't feature space aliens taunting you from the fairway, but Drive Shack isn't like anything else. Merging real golf equipment with augmented reality technology, it allows experienced and amateur players alike to swing at digital monsters or at oversize playing cards in an effort to build a great blackjack hand. A video arcade and on-site, chef-inspired restaurant keep the party going after the 18th hole.

As its name suggests, this all-inclusive entertainment center in Lake Worth Beach is a one-stopshop for adolescent escapism. Fun Depot's signature laser tag attraction, "Laser Force," is played in a black-lit, fog-filled, music-pumping, 4,000-square-foot arena, while a comprehensive gaming arcade and go-cart speedway round out the activities.

The numbers tell the story: 900 animals roam seven naturalistic habitats across the 600 acres of this drive-through wildlife center in the western Palm Beaches, where lions, chimpanzees, ostriches and rhinoceroses enjoy a life of cageless freedom. Amusement park rides, the walk-through Safari World, and a water sprayground are included with regular admission; for a small upcharge, visitors can feed the giraffes and lorikeets.

For an extra price, the Sloth Experience, which offers an opportunity to mingle with the two-toed mammal up close, is an experience to remember.

Turtle Power

Two institutions of The Palm Beaches—one in the northern region, the other in the south—specialize in the tracking, rehabilitation and advocacy of Florida's sea turtles, with fascinating programming to support their missions. The Turtle Walks at Gumbo Limbo Nature Center provide up-close views of nesting sea turtles on the beaches of Boca Raton, while Loggerhead Marinelife Center hosts Sea Turtle Sleepovers featuring tours of its resident turtles.

It's good to be a sports fan in The Palm Beaches. Not only are there more than 160 golf courses, scores of water sports and many other outdoor activities to choose from year-round, but one week in February brings together an elite slate of sporting events that we dub the Ultimate Week of Sports.

During six action-packed days in February, you can catch five different professional sports around The Palm Beaches including polo, PGA golf, professional tennis, professional show jumping and Major League Baseball Spring Training.





THE ULTIMATE WEEK OF SPORTS

Here's our day-by-day guide.

Delray Beach Open-ATP Tennis

Come see elite tennis, both past and present, at the Delray Beach Open—the only tournament in the world to feature both the ATP World Tour and fan-favorite ATP Champions Tour. Spanning more than 28 years, the tournament draws more than 60,000 spectators over 10 days.

Gauntlet of Polo®

Palm Beach International Polo Season rides into town January through April. Throughout those 16 weeks, the world's finest horses, preeminent teams and most skilled players will be competing for the prestigious Gauntlet of Polo®.

In the ultimate survival of the fittest, the Gauntlet of Polo comprises three elite tournaments: the C.V. Whitney Cup®, the USPA Gold Cup® and the U.S. Open Polo Championship®. Any team that consecutively sweeps all three tournaments will earn its place in history as the Gauntlet champion. General admission tickets are available.

Winter Equestrian Festival

Taking place at Wellington International, this long-running festival is considered the world's premier winter gathering of horses and riders. The 12-week show sees only the best riders of their class, including Olympians, adult amateurs, juniors and children from 52 countries and all 50 states. During Week 7 of the Winter Equestrian Festival in Wellington, you can watch elite show jumping and hunter competition. The highlight event of the week will be the Lugano Diamonds Grand Prix CSI5*, which will showcase some of the world's best equestrians, on Saturday evening. In addition to the impressive displays of equestrian sport, spectators will enjoy entertainment, a large variety of vendors and family-friendly children's activities.

PGA Tour Championship

Formerly known as The Honda Classic, this tournament has been bringing top PGA TOUR talent to The Palm Beaches since 2003, providing a week of entertainment and one of the finest fan experiences around. The tournament features a field of hundreds of players and a and a multimilliondollar purse, with net proceeds benefiting the locally based Children's Healthcare Charity.

The competition takes place on the worldrenowned Champion Course at PGA National Resort. Originally designed by Tom and George Fazio, and redesigned by links legend Jack Nicklaus, the course is best known for "The Bear Trap"—a daunting three-hole stretch that is known as one of the biggest challenges in golf. Spectators can check out the shopping area with the new U.S. Polo Assn. apparel shop on-site this year. Be there for the first round.









Major League Baseball Spring Training at Ballpark of The Palm Beaches

Spring Training is a can't-miss experience in The Palm Beaches, where the teams of the Grapefruit League warm up for the regular season under the South Florida sun. The Ballpark of The Palm Beaches in West Palm Beach is the Spring Training home of not one but two World Series competitors: the world-champion Houston Astros and the former world-champion Washington Nationals. See the big-league action from a blanket on the Banana Boat Lawn, or snag a stadium or Field Box seat for an up-close view of some of the best players in the game. Be sure to visit the Craft Corner, where a variety of beer flows from 32 tap handles.

Can't get enough of America's pastime? Head a few miles north to Jupiter's Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium, where the St. Louis Cardinals and Miami Marlins spend their Spring Training. With unparalleled player access and close-up encounters with veteran stars and up-and-coming prospects alike, the Spring Training experience here is truly one-ofa-kind. Settle in for a Grapefruit League showdown with a hot dog and a local craft beer.

African-American History Trail

The Palm Beaches teem with heritage landmarks honoring its vibrant African-American history. Here are a few of these destinations from Delray Beach to West Palm Beach.

The lynchpin of Black history in The Palm Beaches, the **Spady Cultural Heritage Museum** (170 N.W. Fifth Ave., Delray Beach; 561.279.8883) honors Solomon D. Spady, a pioneering Delray Beach educator and community leader, and offers exhibitions, annual events and "Ride & Remember" trolley tours celebrating the African-American history and influence in The Palm Beaches, all from its location in Spady's historic home.

While in the Delray Beach area, stop by the **B.F. James &** Frances Jane Bright Mini-Park on the east side of Northwest Fifth Avenue, 100 feet south of Northwest

First Street. Read the bronze marker commemorating the history of this location and its role connecting the African-American population during the dark days of Jim Crow.

Traveling north to West Palm Beach, visit the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Landmark at Currie Park (2200 N. Flagler Drive; 561.804.4900). The memorial features an impressive bronze bust of the civil rights leader reading a Bible, positioned in front

of a curved granite wall bearing quotes and events from King's life. Continue your West Palm

Beach history trail at the Northwest Neighborhood Historic District (North Rosemary and Douglas avenues, bounded by Northwest Second and 11th streets). а once-segregated portion of West Palm Beach whose buildings were designed by African-American builders, contractors and architects. The district is home to the 1893-vintage Tabernacle Church (801 Eighth St., West Palm Beach: 561.832.8338). which boasts the only Neo-Romanesque Revival architecture in the Northwest District. It also

contains the Sunset Lounge, a legendary concert venue that welcomed Ella Fitzgerald, Louis Armstrong and Count Basie on its stage. The venue is currently undergoing a \$12.5 million renovation to revive the **Sunset Lounge** and its surrounding area to its former glory.
